After graduating with distinction from Portsmouth School of Architecture in 1990, Hugh Petter won two prestigious Rome Scholarships in 1990 and 1991 to study at the British School at Rome. He returned to London in 1992 to establish the Foundation Course at The Prince of Wales's Institute of Architecture where he served as Senior Tutor for six years.

Hugh Petter joined Robert Adam Architects as an Associate in 1993, and became a Director in 1997. He has won several prizes for both academic and architectural projects. His work includes both new exclusive buildings and alterations, extensions and repairs to important historic properties, as well as design consultancy and master-planning on projects in Britain, Italy and North America.

He has published various articles and essays on architectural subjects, is a visiting tutor to several colleges in the UK and abroad and speaks publicly on his areas of expertise. He is an active contributor to many architectural societies.
